Approval of the January 8, 2024, City Council Minutes

On the motion of Council Member Bryant and a second by Council Member Morgan and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the minutes were approved as presented by a vote of 8-0.

Mayor Penn presented the financial reports to the City Council. Monthly city sales tax increased 2.17%, year to date numbers increased by 7.11%. Monthly state/county sales tax increased 1.61%, year to date numbers increased 5.77%.

PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

A public hearing will be held on Monday **February 12th, 2024, at 6:00 p.m.** at Farmington City Hall located at 354 W. Main Farmington, AR 72730 for the purpose of identifying and prioritizing the community needs of Farmington, determining whether an application for Arkansas Community and Economic Development Program (ACEDP) funds should be developed and if so, for what community need. Also, comments on proposed project activities will be discussed, especially those with possible impacts on the community, should the project receive funding.

ACEDP funds are federal assistance received by the State of Arkansas and administered by the Arkansas Economic Development Commission. These funds will be made available to cities and counties according to need and can be used for housing rehabilitation, community facilities, or economic development, but must address one of the following objectives:

- 1. Provide benefit to low and moderate income families,
- 2. Aid in the prevention of slum and blight, or
- 3. Meet other community needs, which pose a serious, immediate threat to the health or welfare of the community where no other funding is available to meet such needs.

All residents of Farmington, AR are encouraged to attend the hearing and participate in the community development process. The City of Farmington will provide technical assistance in developing proposals by groups representing low and moderate-income persons.



We have examined the compliance of the City of Farmington, Arkansas (the City) with the compliance requirements "activities allowed or unallowed" and "allowable cost/cost principles" (the specified requirements) as described in Part IV Requirements for an Alternative Compliance Examination Engagement for Recipients That Would Otherwise be Required to Undergo a Single Audit or Program-Specific Audit as a Result of Receiving Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds of the CSLFRF section of the 2022 OMB Compliance Supplement (referred to herein as Requirements for an Alternative CSLFRF Compliance Examination Engagement) during the year ended December 31, 2022. We are also required to obtain and report the views of responsible officials concerning the findings, conclusions, and recommendations, as well as any planned corrective actions. 2023 State of the City Address

Citizens of Farmington and City Council, it is my honor tonight to present the State of the City address:

I would like to begin by thanking our City employees for their dedication and commitment to make Farmington a better place to live. It takes a team effort every day to provide the services that our Citizens require now and in the future.

I am pleased to report that our City is financially sound and we have maintained excellent cash reserves. Our City and County Sales taxes continue to increase each year. In 2023, Our City Sales tax increased by **7.59**% and our County/State sales tax increased by **6.16**% over 2022.

Based upon our **2023 budget numbers**, Our City Sales tax received is **16% higher** than budgeted and our County/State sales tax was **8.5% higher** than budgeted. I am proud of our financial stability of our City as evidenced by our continued tax growth and bank balances. This increase allows our City to have funds to support expansion of our City services and for Capital improvement projects to begin and be completed without interruption.

The following projects were completed in 2023:

- Successful negotiation of a new 10 year Sewer Contract with City of Fayetteville
- Crack Sealing of streets in Valley View Subdivision, Twin Falls S/d , Windgate S/d , Blue Sky Road , and South Holland Road
- Paving of 3 streets, N. Locust, S Church St. and Bois D Arc
- Drainage improvements on Double Springs Road /Ridgedale, and Goose Creek Pipe replacement
- Goose Creek restriping with Reflectorized Paint pavement markings

Our City will have the following projects to begin in 2024:

- Begin the HWY 170 expansion project with the last of the utilities relocated and the bidding of the road construction project with an anticipated start date of June. Estimated total cost will exceed \$11,000,000. The funding for the construction cost will be provided by ARDOT and FHWA.
- Creekside Park ---Greenway Trail Connection and extra parking lot construction. Estimated cost \$1.2 million. Grant Funding of \$900,000 has been approved and City will fund the remaining cost
- Fire Department Training Tower to be finished
- Construction of Pickle Ball Courts at Creekside park
- Farmington Heights park improvements to be completed
- Paving of 3 streets with State Aid Funds (awaiting final approval)

Our City continues to experience growth in our residential and commercial areas of our city. Growth can be challenging at times, but it can also bring new opportunities for our City and provide additional employment opportunities for our residents.

In 2023, our City issued 213 new residential building permits valued at \$79,483,000. The permits consisted of 151 single family homes and 62 duplexes. This is an increase of 45% over 2022 permits (147) issued.

Our City population from the 2020 Census was 7584. Based upon the projections of the Northwest Regional Planning our city population is 8265 as of the end of 2023. I fully expect our City to grow to 10,000 residents in the next 5 years.

Farmington continues to be a very attractive place for families to locate and send their children to school. Our outstanding school and its facilities continues to be one of the most attractive features of our community. Our school currently has an enrollment of 2848 students.

With the commitment from our City Council, our Fire Department and Police departments will need to continue to grow in personnel so that our residents will have the added security that Farmington is a safe place to live. In addition, we will need to continue to expand our recreational facilities and trails.

I think it is very important for our City to continue to work in conjunction with the Farmington Chamber of Commerce and Farmington schools to help build Farmington into a more attractive place for families and businesses to locate.

In closing, I would like to thank our City Council and Planning commissioners for their outstanding leadership and commitment to our City. I would also like to thank the citizens of Farmington for their continued support of our City and to encourage them to be more involved and celebrate the great community in which we live.

God has blessed our City and we should all be thankful every day for these blessings.

I am very proud and honored to be your Mayor and I look forward to a successful and prosperous 2024 for the City of Farmington.



2. Approval of Minutes: The December 18, 2023, minutes were approved as written.

3. Comments from Citizens:

Howard Carter

Phyllis Young - 546 Goose Creek: Ms. Young said that the subdivision is causing flooding on her land. She said that several months ago at one of the city council meetings one of the city council members was talking and she accidentally heard her say that she thought the reason it was flooding was because it was designed for the hundred-year rain. Ms. Young stated, "You know my land has flooded more than twentyfive times in the last two years. I don't think the last two years we have gotten hundred-year rain and if we have it's been one or two, not anything like twenty-five times. My land had never flooded before. My land had runoff when we got a 3 1/2-to-4-inch rain in a very short period before all this started. It never destroyed the land and didn't cause erosion. There was a little stream that ran through my property that I could just step across, now it floods my land from one side to the other and I can't cross it." If the engineering reports are designed for a hundred-year rain we're not getting hundred-year rains and it's causing flooding on my land. I would like to invite all of you to come out and look at the damage to the land, if it rains all night now it would probably be a good time to do it. As a planning commission I would like to think that you care about the citizens of Farmington, the property that you are approving the stuff for. I have been told in a roundabout way that you can't make the laws more strict than what the Arkansas laws are. There must be some way that you can protect the citizens from their land getting destroyed. I'm hoping when we get the April court date that will take care of it, but I would like you to come and see the damages.

Having no further comments, Chairman Robert Mann closed the floor for public comments.

Public Hearings

1A Rezoning; 9 Locust Street from R-1 to C-2; Presented by Phillip Shepard

Phillip Shepard 562 Rheas Mill: Mr. Shepard said that he and the previous owner, who owns the other part of Locust Street, Keith Marrs, that he had gotten this approved two months ago. Mr. Shepard said he tried to get it through the timeframe of December. The goal for Locust Street is another Farmington struggle with small business zoning so the end goal for Locust Street is to provide small business opportunities for chiropractors, psychologists, and whoever else could rent out potentially. So the idea is not to tear it all down to make a huge complex but to have the opportunity for more small businesses in Farmington.

City Business Manager Melissa McCarville said the Land Use Plan indicates commercial for that area. Mr. Shepard said a few months ago Keith Marrs just rezoned the property immediately adjacent to C-2.

City Attorney Jay Moore stated that Mr. Shepard would have been on the agenda last month except for paperwork issues and it's the same as Mr. Marrs presented just an adjacent piece of property in the same square.

Keith Macedo asked which property Keith Marrs had. Jay Moore said it was the church at the Northwest corner. Mr. Shepard's property will be to the east.

Mr. Sheperd said the building is three stories but can't use the top floor.

There was no public comment. Having no further comments, Chairman Robert Mann called for question, and the request was approved 6-0.

1B Re-Plat Final Plat Subdivision; Presented by Engineering Services, Inc.

Kyle Davin with Engineering Services, Inc. said this item is just a simple replat taking away the middle lot line between two lots. Chairman Robert Mann asked if they were making the lots bigger? City Engineer said making two lots into one. City Business Manager Melissa McCarville said that this would normally be administrative but because it is in a platted subdivision it had to be re-platted. Chairman Robert Mann asked Mr. Davin if he had read Chris Brackett's memo dated January 24, 2024. Chris Brackett stated, "I don't think I gave it to him."

City Engineer Chris Brackett read a memo listing conditions for approval: "The Re-Plat of the Final Plat for the Bethel Elm Subdivision has been reviewed and it is my opinion that the Planning Commission's approval should be conditional on the following comments."

1. Provide one original and 6 copies of the recorded plat to the city.

Chairman Mann asked if Mr. Davin was ok with the memo and Mr. Davin said yes.

There was no public comment. Having no further comments, Chairman Robert Mann called for question, and the request was approved 6-0.

Chairman Mann said he meant to send out an email today but got sidetracked. The work session was cancelled due to the weather. He had a list of things that were put on last year's agenda that were not addressed. Chairman Mann said he would send out an email and asked for the planning commissioners to send him suggestions for the next work session on Tuesday, February 20th.

Adjournment: Having no further business, Bobby Wilson moved to adjourn, seconded by Howard Carter. Motion was approved, and meeting was adjourned.








All ORT Passengers - Weekday Ridership Trends - January 2020 to Present
