## MINUTES

### Minutes of the Regular Farmington City Council Meeting January 9th 2023

The regular meeting of the Farmington City Council scheduled for Monday, January 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023 was called to order at 6:00 pm by Mayor Ernie Penn. City Clerk Kelly Penn called the roll and the following Council Members answered to their names: Diane Bryant, Brenda Cunningham, Sherry Mathews, Hunter Carnahan, Linda Bell, Bobby Morgan and Kara Gardenhire. Also present was City Attorney Jay Moore and City Business Manager McCarville. City Council Member Keith Lipford was absent.

### **Comments from Citizens**

Mayor Penn asked if there was anyone who wished to comment at this time.

Phyllis Young, 546 Goose Creek Road addressed the city council regarding the preliminary plat at Goose Creek, she objected to the approval after 2 years of drainage issues. She expected it to be corrected instead of being ignored. She implored the council to do their due diligence. She will continue to fight to get drainage corrected.

### Approval of the minutes for the December 12th, 2022 Regular Meeting.

On the motion of Council Member Cunningham and a second by Council Member Bryant and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the minutes were approved as presented by a vote of 7-0.

#### Financial Reports.

Mayor Penn presented the financial reports to the City Council. City sales tax increased 8.33% and State sales tax increased 14.02% for the month.

Mr. Toering will fill the seat vacated by Planning Commissioner Jay Moore.

## Resolution No 2023-01 A Resolution establishing the procedural rules for the City Council of the City of Farmington, Arkansas for 2023.

On the motion of Council Member Carnahan and a second by Council Member Cunningham and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the motion to approve Resolution 2023-01 was approved 7-0. City Attorney Jay Moore read the resolution by title only.

## Resolution No 2023-02 A Resolution in support of an application for the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant.

On the motion of Council Member Bell and a second by Council Member Bryant and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the motion to approve Resolution 2023-02 was approved 7-0. City Attorney Jay Moore read the resolution by title only.

## Resolution No 2023-03 A Resolution providing for the adoption of the amended budget for the City of Farmington, Arkansas for the 12 months beginning January 1, 2022 and December 31, 2022: appropriating money for each item, and for other purposes.

On the motion of Council Member Bryant and a second by Council Member Carnahan and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the motion to approve Resolution 2023-03 was approved 7-0. City Attorney Jay Moore read the resolution by title only.

## Ordinance No. 2023-01 An ordinance waving competitive bidding for the purchase of three new Dodge Chargers and the equipment to outfit vehicles for the Farmington Police Department.

Mayor Penn called for public comment, there was none. Council Member Carnahan made a motion to suspend the rule requiring the reading of an ordinance in full on three different dates be suspended and for Ordinance 2023-01 be read one time by title only, it was seconded by Council Member Cunningham and after a roll call vote, the motion was approved 7-0. City Attorney Moore read Ordinance 2023-01 by title only. Mayor Penn asked shall the ordinance pass? After a roll call vote, the motion passed 7-0. A motion to pass Ordinance 2023-01 with an Emergency Clause was made by Council Member Carnahan and seconded by Council Member Morgan after a roll call vote the motion passed 7-0.

## Ordinance No. 2023-02 An ordinance to incorporate connectivity provisions into our street standards ordinance and all amendments.

Mayor Penn called for public comment, there was none. Council Member Bryant made a motion to suspend the rule requiring the reading of an ordinance in full on three different dates be suspended and for Ordinance 2023-02 be read one time by title only, it was seconded by Council Member Carnahan and after a roll call vote, the motion was approved 7-0. City Attorney Moore read Ordinance 2023-02 by title only. Mayor Penn asked shall the ordinance pass? After a roll call vote, the motion passed 7-0. A motion to pass Ordinance 2023-02 with an Emergency Clause was made by Council Member Morgan and seconded by Council Member Carnahan after a roll call vote the motion passed 7-0.

Phyllis Young asked if she could make 2 comments on things the council discussed. She said she knew it was not the right time and she could come back next month. Mayor Penn gave her permission to speak to the council. Her first comment was a request to have subdivisions do the drainage first instead of whenever they want. Her second comment was that the new culvert out on Goose Creek that recently got new cement has some holes in it and could Floyd come look at it. Mayor Penn thanked her for her comments.

There being no further business to come before the council and on the motion of Council Member Morgan and seconded by Council Member Bryant and by the consent of all members present, the meeting adjourned at 6:40 pm until the next regularly scheduled meeting to be held Monday, February 13, 2023 in the City Council Chambers at City Hall, located at 354 West Main Street, Farmington, Arkansas.

### ORDINANCE NO. 2023-03

AN ORDINANCE WAIVING REQUIREMENTS OF COMPETITIVE BIDDING FOR THE PURCHASE OF FORTY-SIX (46) MOBILE AND TWENTY-TWO (22) PORTABLE RADIOS AND ASSOCIATED EQUIPMENT FOR THE FARMINGTON POLICE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO A.C.A. §14-58-303(b)(2)(B)

WHEREAS, the Farmington Police Department is in the process of acquiring new mobile and portable radios for immediate use for the Farmington Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the radios are immediately available from Smith Two Way Radio of Fayetteville; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF FARMINGTON, ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1: That due to the exceptional situation as described herein, competitive bidding for the purchase of forty-six mobile (46) and twenty-two (22) portable radios and associated equipment for the Farmington Police Department is deemed to be neither feasible nor practicable.

SECTION 2: That in accordance with A.C.A. §14-58-303(b)(2)(B), which state, "the governing body, by ordinance, may waive the requirements of competitive bidding in exceptional situations where this procedure is deemed not feasible nor practical," the City of Farmington, Arkansas, through its city council, is hereby authorized to purchase forty-six mobile (46) and twenty-two (22) portable radios and associated equipment, with the total authorized expenditure not to exceed \$199,773.34.

SECTION 3: Emergency Clause: That the Farmington City Council further determines that this ordinance is necessary to provide forty-six mobile (46) and twenty-two (22) portable radios and associated equipment for the Farmington Police Department; and for purchasing said equipment at the lowest possible cost through procurement contracts; therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

### Recommendation

Request the approval to purchase 46 mobile, and 22 portable radios with programming and accessories from Smith Two-Way Radio in Fayetteville AR.

#### Background

The current radio system is approximately 15 years old and on the brink of catastrophic failure. A subcommittee was formed to discuss new radios and a system to join AWIN for the state of Arkansas. After lengthy meetings and discussions, the county agreed to place it on the ballot for a \$0.25 sales tax which was passed by the voters of the county back in 2020. Washington County went with Motorola for the entire system and a contract was signed. The contract included some mobile and portable radios, but if the end user needed to purchase additional radios, Motorola was roughly 3X the price of a Kenwood. The projected Cut Over (Go Live) date is projected for 6/22/2023.

#### Discussion

The need for a new radio system is imperative considering the age and condition of the current system. I am requesting to go with all Kenwood units for the police department because it is a proven unit. I went with Smith Two-Way Radio because they have been serving the state and surrounding states for over 90 years. They have been the radio provider for Farmington Police Department since it began. The Motorola radios that we would receive would belong to Washington County, so when we finish with them we would have to return them. This particular radio would cause me to have to order new consoles and brackets for all patrol units. If we went with the Kenwood radio then we would have ownership of all equipment. We can still utilize the current console and only have to change the existing brackets. If we have an issue with a Motorola radio, we would have to contact their repair center and wait on an appointment for a technician. Smith Two-Way most normally can have you fixed the same day. Down time is critical when talking about your radio system.

### **Budget Impact**

\$199,773.34

Money for this purchase will be utilized from the ARPA funds that was placed in the General Account.

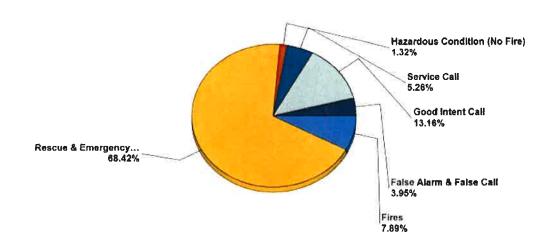

### Planning Commission Minutes January 23, 2023 at 6 PM

**1. ROLL CALL** – Meeting which was available in person was called to order by Chair Robert Mann. A quorum was present.

- 2. Approval of Minutes: The November and December 2022 minutes were approved as written.
- 3. Comments from Citizens: None.

### **Public Hearings:**

4A. Preliminary Plat- Goose Creek Ph. 5; Owner - Red Canyon Development; Location - west of Goose Creek Ph. 2; Presented by Jorgensen & Associates:

Jared Inman with Jorgensen & Associates was present to discuss the request. There will be 101 buildable lots. Mr. Inman had received City Engineer Brackett's memo that listed conditions for approval of the Preliminary Plat. We added a condition of no construction traffic is to go through Silverthorne Subdivision. They need to block off McCloud until the streets are paved and houses are built. This would then be referred to the Fire Marshall for further review.

Chris Brackett's memo with conditions is as follows:

"The Preliminary Plat for the Goose Creek Village Phase V has been reviewed and it is our opinion that the Planning Commission's approval should be conditional on the following comments.

- 1. The fire hydrant locations and traffic circle shown on the plat must be reviewed and approved by the Fire Department.
- 2. The water and sewer improvements must be reviewed and approved by the City of Fayetteville Engineering Department and the Arkansas Department of Health prior to construction plan approval.
- 3. Payment in lieu of Park Land Conveyance will be required for this subdivision at \$600 per single family unit. This fee will be \$60,600 for the 101 lots.
- 4. Lot 263 shall be shown as unbuildable.
- 5. A completed Grading Permit Application and fee must be submitted prior to final approval of the plans. A preconstruction conference will be required prior to any mass grading on the site. The owner, their engineering consultant, and their contractor responsible for the best management practices will be required to attend this conference.
- 6. After a final review set of plans and drainage report has been approved by KMS, the applicant should submit to the City two (2) sets of full size plans and three (3) sets of half size plans, and two (2) copies of the final drainage report that have been sealed by the engineer of record for final approval and distribution."

### **Public Comment:**

Phyllis Young- 546 Goose Creek: She objects to any further development until the drainage is fixed. She stated that she is not there to argue the merits of the lawsuit. This has caused the drainage to channel onto her property causing damage. There is more velocity from the subdivisions going down her property. There have been many other citizens that are stating the same things for their properties. She wants the Planning Commission to not approve the preliminary plat for the fifth phase. She has pictures to share showing the damage done to her property.

Derek Travis-13975 Little Elm: He has given his impact statement. He has lived next to Goose Creek for a year. His land has flooded and caused damage. Since his land is not in the flood plain he didn't have flood insurance. In order to purchase flood insurance the cost was very high. We need to consider the growth and the effect that it will have on drainage. Can they not get more retention or drainage plans?

Mark Bradley - 693 Goose Creek: He owns 50 acres along Goose Creek. He would like a committee be formed to study before and after development impacts. We would like to have scientific studies and erosion studies done as well. The erosion has taken some of his farmland and he wonders how much that will take from his farmland in future.

Delcina Cunico - 31671 Goose Creek: She agrees with the other citizens. Goose Creek encompasses Farmington, Fayetteville and Washington County. There were floods on her property back in 2011, 2017 and 2022. Her other concern about phase 5 is does it encompass an additional 12 acres.. She doesn't believe that one detention area will handle the drainage.

Shane Sparks- 13579 Goose Creek: He had flooding on his property. He had 18 inches of water running through his house. He is concerned for his 74 year old mother who lived on the property. He did have flood insurance but they have taken a lot of time to evaluate the damages and it is still not fixed. It has been a difficult process and the flooding has impacted their lives.

Hal Henson- 11651 E. Creek Lane: He is concerned about some possible drainage issues behind his house. About three months ago, he saw trucks in the 40 acre field behind his house. He is concerned with the growth of Farmington which will continue to be an issue. The 400 homes that are in his subdivision will be impacted and will continue to be impacted as development proceeds. He wants to raise the level of decision making.

The committee to document the before and after of each development would be a good idea. City Attorney, Jay Moore addressed the room. If a development meets everything set forth in our Ordinances and State/Federal Laws we can not deny the developers. They have a right to build as long as they have met these criteria. If denied the City becomes open to a lawsuit from the developer. The Planning Commission reviews the ordinances to see if the developer meets all of our requirements. In order for change to happen, the ordinances have to be changed. There is a legal burden to determine if the developer has met all our ordinance requirements. Robert Mann stated going forward we will need to make tweaks to our ordinances. Jay Moore, City Attorney, stated Phyllis Young has filed more legal documents which may change things. Keith Macedo asked if the plats are available to view online. The plats will always be available to review at City Hall. We also have the capability to get them the plats via email or in person. Keith asked if the detention was the same as Phase I, II, and III. This was confirmed by Jared Inman with Jorgensen & Associates. Chris Brackett explained that for the Final Plat will be the next step. There will be a preconstruction conference. They will be issued a grading permit to build and pave the roads. Houses can not be built until the infrastructure is complete.

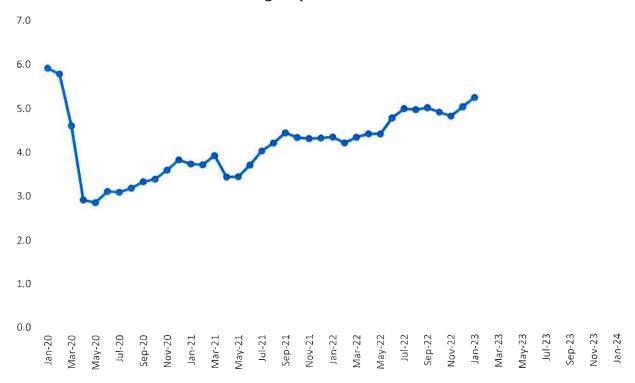

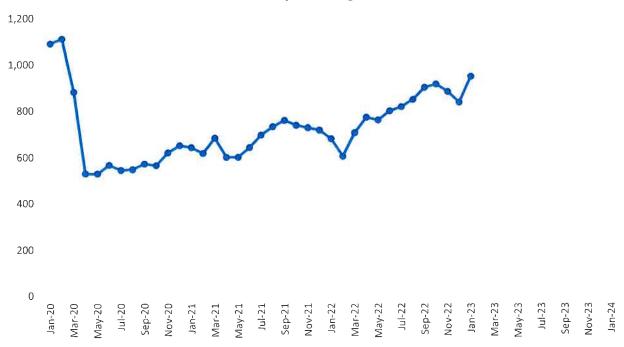


### All ORT Passengers - Weekday Ridership Trends - January 2020 to Present
