MINUTES OF THE REGULAR FARMINGTON CITY COUNCIL MEETING JUNE 12, 2023

The regular meeting of the Farmington City Council scheduled for Monday, June 12, 2023 was called to order at 6:00 pm by Mayor Ernie Penn. City Clerk Kelly Penn called the roll and the following Council Members answered to their names: Diane Bryant, Keith Lipford, Brenda Cunningham, Sherry Mathews, Hunter Carnahan, Linda Bell, Bobby Morgan, and Kara Gardenhire. Also present were City Attorney Jay Moore and City Business Manager McCarville. Mayor Penn led the pledge of allegiance.

COMMENTS FROM THE CITIZENS

Phyllis Young, 546 Goose Creek Road – advised the city council the drainage flow and velocity had increased on her property, it floods all the time and rocks and trash are all over her land. She is concerned that hay haulers are no longer able to use her property and have to get out on Goose Creek Road and that is a safety hazard. She had a gate constructed and it has debris washed up against it and it's about to fall over. She is concerned with the planning commission approving a cul de sac in Goose Creek Village and now it is greenspace and a road. People can't buy lots and the engineers, Chris Brackett and Jorgenson & Associates, planned to put a road there all along and that's false advertising and does the city want that type of reputation?

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES FOR THE MAY 8, 2023 REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING

On the motion of Council Member Bryant and a second by Council Member Carnahan and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the minutes were approved as presented by a vote of 8-0.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES FOR THE JUNE 13, 2022 REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING

City Clerk Penn advised the council that during the current review by Legislative Audit there was an agenda item left off the approved minutes of the June 13, 2022 meeting. It was a clerical error that the item was not attached to the approved minutes. The auditors and city business manager McCarville reviewed the recording of the meeting, and it was determined the council did approve the item and Legislative Audit recommended the minutes be amended to reflect it. On the motion of Council Member Carnahan and a second by Council Member Bryant and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the amended minutes were approved as presented by a vote of 8-0.

FINANCIAL REPORTS

Mayor Penn presented the financial reports to the City Council. Monthly city sales tax increased 3.8%. Year to date, our total sales tax is up 4.04% versus 2022 sales tax numbers. Monthly state/county sales tax increased 6.68%. Year to date, our total sales tax is up 9.35% versus 2022 sales tax numbers.

On the motion of Council Member Cunningham and a second by Council Member Mathews and by the consent of all Council Members present after a roll call vote, the motion to read all Ordinances and Resolutions by title was approved 8-0.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-09 AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT A REVISED PERSONNEL POLICY FOR THE CITY OF FARMINGTON, ARKANSAS.

City Business Manager McCarville informed the council that the auditors from Legislative Audit had requested the city update the overtime policy to agree with the Fair Labor Standards Act. Our policy indicated we would pay overtime for hours worked over 8 hours in a day versus the new policy that will require overtime for hours worked over 40 hours in a week. There is also language added to address overtime pay for 24-hour shift firefighters. There is no budget impact, and the city will not be cited for any deficiencies with this in place. Mayor Penn asked for public comment, there was none. Council Member Cunningham made a motion to suspend the rule requiring the reading of an ordinance in full on three different dates be suspended and for Ordinance 2023-09 be read one time by title only, it was seconded by Council Member Lipford and after a roll call vote, the motion was approved 8-0. City Attorney Moore read Ordinance 2023-09 by title only. Mayor Penn asked Shall the ordinance pass? After a roll call vote, the motion passed 8-0. A motion to pass Ordinance 2023-09 with an Emergency Clause was made by Council Member Bryant and seconded by Council Member Lipford and after a roll call vote the motion passed 8-0.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-10 AN ORDINANCE REZONING PROPERTY AT 102 CYNTHIA AVENUE FROM R-1, SINGLE FAMILY RESIDIENTIAL, TO R-O, RESIDENTIAL OFFICE AS REQUESTED BY MELTON NALL.

Council Member Carnahan made a motion to suspend the rule requiring the reading of an ordinance in full on three different dates be suspended and for Ordinance 2023-10 be read one time by title only, it was seconded by Council Member Bryant and after a roll call vote, the motion was approved 8-0. City Attorney Moore read Ordinance 2023-10 by title only. Mayor Penn asked Shall the ordinance pass? After a roll call vote, the motion passed 8-0. A motion to pass Ordinance 2023-10 with an Emergency Clause was made by Council Member Bryant and seconded by Council Member Morgan and after a roll call vote the motion passed 8-0.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-11 AN ORDINANCE WAIVING REQUIREMENTS OF COMPETITIVE BIDDING FOR THE PURCHASE OF A NEW BRUSH TRUCK FROM BANNER FIRE EQUIPMENT FOR THE FARMINGTON FIRE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO A.C.A. §14-58-303 (b) 2 (B)

Fire Chief Hellard informed the council that there were no trucks available in the approved state bid and that inventories were low, making it difficult to secure a vehicle. He requested the council approval to accept the bid from Banner Fire Equipment to purchase a 2023 Dodge 3500 Brush Truck, with funds allocated up to \$95,000.00. Mayor Penn asked for public comment, there was none. After council discussion Council Member Lipford made a motion to suspend the rule requiring the reading of an ordinance in full on three different dates be suspended and for Ordinance 2023-11 be read one time by title only, it was seconded by Council Member Mathews and after a roll call vote, the motion was approved 8-0. City Attorney Moore read Ordinance 2023-11 by title only. Mayor Penn asked Shall the ordinance pass? After a roll call vote, the motion to approve Ordinance 2023-11 passed 8-0. A motion to pass Ordinance 2023-11 with an Emergency Clause was made by Council Member Bryant and seconded by Council Member Lipford and after a roll call vote the motion passed 8-0.

City Attorney Moore left the meeting at 6:37 pm.

There being no further business to come before the council and on the motion of Council Member Mathews and seconded by Council Member Morgan and by the consent of all members present, the meeting adjourned at 6:46 pm until the next regularly scheduled meeting to be held Monday, July 10th, 2023 in the City Council Chambers at City Hall, located at 354 West Main Street, Farmington, Arkansas.





Recommendation

Request the approval to purchase 17 AXON Bodycam 4's with FLEX.

Background

The cameras we currently use are nearing the end of their warranty with the TAP (Technology Assurance Plan) program. AXON no longer makes this model and is taking longer to get issues fixed with the cameras when they arise. We are constantly sending units back for repair which causes hardships for the department by operating with the minimum cameras needed for officers. Since technology upgrades happen constantly, we are trying to stay ahead of the curve to help protect the officer, the department and most importantly the city. This camera system is what the department has been using since the beginning.

Discussion

Under the TAP program we can purchase 17 AXON Bodycam 4's with FLEX. The TAP program allows us to purchase 17 cameras up front with the assurance plan (service contract). After 2.5 and 5 years in the program the cameras get traded in on new cameras without having to add additional costs. The cameras are needed for the safety of officers. With the TAP program, all of our video evidence is stored cloud based through AXON. We are also able to redacted sensitive information on the videos prior to fulfilling FOIA & court requests. This is an essential tool for the job we perform.

Budget Impact

This was not a budgeted item. The AXON Bodycam 4 with FLEX is a new, top of the line product and will need to be ordered soon to ensure we have them before the current TAP program expires.

I am requesting the addition of a Deputy Chief position to help the police department stay in line with other department's locally and statewide. This position will fill in and carry all the powers of Chief of Police during my absence. This will give another line of upper level supervision and allow us to expand more leadership roles on other shifts.

Budget Impact

We are requesting this position be at a pay grade of 20.

TITLE DEPARTMENT REPORTS TO

Deputy Chief Farmington Police Department Chief of Police

SCOPE OF RESPONSIBILITY

He/She shall be under the direction of the Chief of Police, administer and supervise the law enforcement and administrative endeavors of the department.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. The Deputy Chief is exposed to the same hazards and has the same obligations as all other sworn police officers.
- 2. Plans, coordinates, directs and controls the operations under his/her command.
- 3. He/She shall personally see that the policies and orders of the department and the division are carried out in their true spirit and intent.
- 4. Maintains communications and liaison with other agencies, as well as other units within the department, and the general public at the direction or absence of the Chief.
- 5. Represents the department at various social, civic, and professional meetings.
- 6. Promote growth and development of subordinates and other command staff by counseling, advising and explaining as required.
- 7. Reviews disciplinary actions and commendations submitted by other command staff.
- 8. Attends staff meetings to coordinate the activities of the division with other divisions and to help formulate the policy and guidelines for the department.
- 9. Regularly evaluates the work of all personnel in the department.
- 10. Provides regular reports to the Chief of Police of activities and goal accomplishments.

- 11. He/She is the direct representative of the Chief of Police.
- 12. He/She shall have such general administrative duties as prescribed by the Chief of Police which are consistent with his/her detail.
- 13. Resolves unusual personal problems of the general public and employees, caused by emotional stress, conflicts, etc.
- 14. He/She shall promptly investigate any delinquent moral conduct, laxity in performance of duty, or actions of police personnel which are detrimental to the best interests of the organization and the City of Farmington.
- 15. He/She shall recommend to the Chief of Police such assignments of personnel which will, in his/her judgment promote greater efficiency of operation.



2022 ANNUAL REPORT

This annual report provides updates of the library's initiatives along with highlights of the year. On behalf of all of the Library Board, library staff and the Friends of the Library, thank you for your support in 2022. It is our hope to enrich all the lives we can with access to resources, services, and programs.

Services & Amenities

The library focused on the patron experience through improved service delivery and refined access to amenities. As our community changes, we look to improve our offerings and to serve as a hub of services, a co-working space and always as the third place between school/work and home.

We partnered with eSCO Processing and Recycling as a drop off location for small electronic waste disposal. Over 3,100 of you logged onto our computers and many more made use of the high-speed WiFi over a newly installed fiber connection. The library added improved wayfinding signage and the Friends of the Library donated art rails. With nearly 600 patrons using the study room and meeting room, it is no surprise we continue to prioritize comfortable meeting, study, and working spaces.

Programs & Collections

People come the library to be together and follow their interests. In 2022, over 20,000 people visited and 1,052 patrons attended 131 free programs. Family film showings, story hours, music programs, and hands-on workshops were just some of the opportunities to explore what you are excited about at the library.

The library presented "Read Beyond the Beaten Path" in June and July and received two Artists on Tour grants from the Arkansas Arts Council to host presenters. For summer, the Children's Department also presented a family book club of "The Nocturnals" with an author visit by Tracey Hecht. In the fall, Crystal Bridges "CB to You" mobile art lab visited and for National Library Card Sign-up Month new library card designs from contest winners Victoria Watson and Isabella Dixon were available.

Patrons can discover digital resources with Libby, Hoopla, and TumbleBookLibrary. The most popular print titles were The Pigeon Has To Go To School!, Dog Man: Lord of the Fleas, and Where the Crawdads Sing. Circulation of physical and eMaterials totaled 53,694. Whether you are new to Farmington or a longtime resident, we want you to know the Farmington Public Library is YOUR library.

Call to Order – Chair Regina Sherwood called the meeting to order at 6:03 p.m.

Attendees – Linda Morrow, LaDeana Mullinix, Judy Phillips, Anita Sampley, Regina Sherwood, Jill Simpson. Also in attendance – Rachel Sawyer, Librarian.

Agenda – Jill Simpson motioned to approve the agenda and LaDeana Mullinix seconded. Motion carried, 5-0.

Minutes – The minutes from the March 14, 2023 meeting were read and approved without correction.

Reports – LaDeana Mullinix motioned to accept all reports as written and a second by Judy Phillips was approved 5-0.

- 1. Director's and Children's reports
 - a. A bench is being purchased in memory of Edna Davis, new planters and estimate received for landscaping improvements with assistance from the Art and Building committee.
 - b. Friends with the help of FFA installed two little free libraries at Creekside Park. Friends will meet next on September 16.
 - c. Scott Baker's last day was May 17. The opening was posted on June 16.
 - d. Summer programs started on May 23 with Crystal Bridges Mobile Art Tour CB to You presenting. State Poet Laureate Suzanne Rhodes visited. As of June 25, 24 programs have been presented with 429 people participating. Staff will take a break from children's and special event programs in August. Staff are planning a month-long series of author visits in September. Those interested should contact the library.

Planning Commission Minutes May 22, 2023 at 6 PM

1. **ROLL** CALL – The in-person meeting was called to order by Chair Robert Mann. A quorum was present.

2. Approval of Minutes: The May 22, 2023 minutes were approved as written.

3. Comments from Citizens:

Matt Bates – 455 N. Yona Lane: Mr. Bates gave each of the Commissioners a map of his house in Goose Creek Subdivision (copy attached). He bought a house on Lot 25 two years ago from Riggins Construction, who were bought out last year by DR Horton. He bought the house because it was in a cul-de-sac, with no neighbors on one side and green space and drainage in the cul-de-sac. Now there is no cul-de-sac, they tore up the cul-de-sac and made a road and he was not happy about that. Chairman Robert Mann said it would be taken under advisement.

Phyllis Young- 546 Goose Creek: Ms. Young stated she was there once again because of the flooding on her land. This week she was asked why she keeps coming here, and the reason is because in the end she has faith that the truth is going to come out about this. Also she wants commissioners to take more concern, and actively do more checking before voting to let some developer drain the increased water flow from their subdivision on someone's land.

Ms. Young said she realized the Commission takes the engineers word what's going to happen, but evidentially they know what's going to happen because this one is not happening like they said it. Therefore, there are errors that can be made and maybe you could ask the people that own the land what is happening up front before anything is ever done. Instead of waiting until a flood comes and floods one side of the valley to the other and destroys the property.

Ms. Young said she would like to think Chris Brackett knows what he is doing as far as his engineering goes but she knows he's not right about this situation; he's not right in the least. Ms. Young also says she knows City Attorney Jay Moore is not there tonight to tell you that you can't talk to me so I'll tell you, you're not supposed to talk to me, She mentioned that earlier, Gerry Harris was going to go look at her land in question with Building Official Rick Bramall. However, Ms. Young did not know if she had been able to go see the damage. She begged Commissioners to go look at the damage for themselves, for future reference. She said City Engineer Chris Brackett has been out there twice and if he came back, he could see the damage. Public Works Manager Floyd Shelley has been there and he could see the damage. Ms. Young stated there were no rocks in the valley from one

side to the other before this all started and now there are probably ten million rocks, there are deep holes and you can hardly drive down there.

She closed by stating that she would like to think that at least half of the Commissioners sitting there would want to protect citizens, to make decisions for the good of the people. She also hoped someone would have enough gumption to go out and see it for their own knowledge. Then maybe it's time for this Planning Commission and City Council to step up with Mr. Penn and say they might have been wrong in this situation and do something about it. Ms. Young stated that City Attorney Jay Moore said it will play out in court but court keeps getting cancelled and prolonged and now it's been pushed to August.

Public Hearings:

4A. Variance - Adam Kirkendall & Ian Howard; property located at 10881 Blue Sky Road; presented by Bates & Associates:

Adam Kirkendall - 4764 W. Crossvine Drive, Fayetteville said that all they were asking for was a lot split and as a result neither tract would meet the minimum road frontage requirements. Instead each lot frontage would be 165.41 feet instead of 200 feet. He stated that each split lot would meet the 2 acre minimum requirement for an RE-1 zone.

City Business Manager Melissa McCarville stated that Mr. Kirkendall basically wants to do a lot split and we require 200 feet of frontage in that zoning and he is asking to reduce that frontage.

There was no public comment.

Judy Horne stated she had great concerns with this because the neighborhood is a premier neighborhood in Farmington. She looked at the map provided and divided the piece of property and then compared the width to the other properties already there and those would be the two narrowest width frontages. She also mentioned that there is a creek and large wooded area at the back of the lot so the usable land is a little deceptive. Mr. Kirkendall said that the plan was to divert the creek which currently runs east and west further south along the property line and then it would be a lot bigger area. Melissa McCarville reminded that they would need to do a flood plain development plan. Judy asked what was on the other side of this property, and Mr. Kirkendall said there are other ponds and it would all flow on their property and would not change any flow.

Commissioner Chad Ball asked about the size of the front setbacks of each house. Mr. Kirkendall said they were planning on staggering both houses in these lots. The first one would be about 100 ft. from the front and the other one would be about 50 ft. from the front and staggering them would make them fit better in the neighborhood. Chad Ball said he was looking at the zoning ordinance RE-1 requires a 50' front setback so the houses would comply. Also, they both will be larger than the 2 acre requirement since they will both be 2.5 acres each. He said regarding granting variances, our code suggests that the variance be in keeping with the spirit and intent of the provisions of the zoning ordinance. He concluded by noting that no property owners on Blue Sky spoke against the lot split. Therefore, for all those reasons, he would be in support of the variance.

Melissa McCarville said that Mr. Kirkendall sent out notices to neighbors which he did not have to do for a variance. Gerry Harris suggested perhaps one big driveway could be utilized for both lots. Mr. Kirkendall said yes they could do a split driveway. Melissa McCarville said they are still doing two

lots and will have to have 200 ft. of frontage per lot. Mr. Kirkendall said if it was going to be too much

of a problem they would install a shared driveway. Melissa McCarville then said they could do a tandem line and put one in the front and one in the back then you would need 60 ft. Mr. Kirkendall said they were going to split it north and south.

Judy Horne said she was still concerned about drainage, wondering why the existing pond on the east was so large, if water was not a problem there. Also she questioned the creek diversion. Mr. Kirkendall said that he does this for a living and diverts rivers, streams, creeks all the time and is not as complicated as it sounds. That area where the water will be channeled goes toward an existing man-made pond and the drainage should not be an issue. He said the pond did not belong to any resident on Blue Sky.

Request was approved 6 - 1 with Judy Horne voting No.

4B. Rezoning – From A-1 to RE-2, Property owned by Nick Limbird. Location – 11294 N. Hwy 170, Presented by Bart Bauer

Bart Bauer, 3804 Copper Ridge Road, Little Flock; He explained that when they developed Hillcrest on the west side of Highway 170, they were allowed 85 sewer taps but only used 82. So they plan to use the 3 remaining taps for a piece of property across the street from Hillcrest Subdivision. The stone house will remain on 1.44 acres and it and septic system will be renovated. The three remaining lots are: 1.1 acres, 1.09 acres, and 3.45 acres. Melissa McCarville reminded that acreage requirement for RE-2 is one acre.

Judy Horne asked if each one of these lots have their own driveway off Hwy 170. Mr. Bauer said yes because that way they will be able to get three additional lots on the property. Judy Horne noted that these properties' driveways will come out on Hwy 170 at one of its most dangerous parts.

Chad Ball asked about Tract 1 (parcel 0289) where it appeared the parcel was in the street, Melissa said yes some do go across the street. They have all of these parcel numbers and once they split it, there will be four legal descriptions once it is re-platted and rezoned. He asked what type of improvements, i.e. sidewalks were required; sidewalks won't be required for the lot splits.

There was no public comment.

No further comments were made and upon roll call vote, request was approved 7-0






All ORT Passengers - Weekday Ridership Trends - January 2020 to Present






